FROM OUR RECTOR

One Parish: Five Churches

At our PCC meeting tonight, we will be having a discussion about what it means to be one parish with five separate churches.

Many of us will have grown up with one Vicar for each church. Sadly, that arrangement is a rarity in much of the Church of England these days, so we are forced to make multi-church situations like ours work as well as they can. Such arrangements bring extra challenges, not least logistically as we try to make sure that all the various different services are covered! But there are joys that come with those challenges: being able to have different styles of worship in different places so that we can, God willing, attract people from right across the demographic variety in our town.

That is summed up in the 3rd of our key values: being **VARIED** –committed to offering a rich variety of worship styles across our churches to ensure that there is a home for everyone. But we are also committed to being FAITHFUL, WELCOMING, ACTIVE AND LOVING- and some of those are harder to enshrine when we have 5 distinct worshipping congregations.

So we're going to spend some time reflecting on what is going well and how we might grow more together. Do ask your PCC reps at the weekend how the discussion panned out!

One Benefice: 2 Parishes: 6 Churches.

But as well as being 5 churches in one parish, we are also a part of a 2 parish, 6 church benefice with St Luke's. Now that Father Mathew has had a year to settle in, (remember he is also Vicar for St John's Bovey Tracey), we felt it was time to look to strengthen the links across the benefice, as well as the parish.



So, Gareth, Matthew and I agreed to take some time away together and we spent a day at the Sheldon Retreat Centre last week.

We spent some time reading and discussing the whole of St Peter's second letter, praying together and talking about how we might develop a real visible sense that we are one benefice. As a result, we agreed to do the following things:

- Continue to meet regularly as benefice clergy, to support and encourage one another.
- Organise pulpit swaps throughout the year. Fr Matthew and Rev Gareth are team/benefice Vicars after all, and I'm Rector of Milber. So, keep your eyes peeled for a surprise preacher some Sundays!
- Join in each other's PCCs. All benefice clergy have the right to attend both PCCs in the benefice- and we hope by doing so from time to time we will get a better understanding of what is going on in each of our churches.
- Reach out with the gospel together. The poorest area of the benefice is Buckland, so we are going to work together on finding ways to reach out into that part of town with the good news of Jesus. We'll also be continuing our town centre outreach on a regular basis and are both building links with Christians Against Poverty.

These 4 aims are on top of our shared Evensongs, (*the next date is 5:30pm on Sunday 23rd February at St Mary's Wolborough*), and planning special shared events like the one we had last December with Rev Dr Chris Moore who came to speak to us about Mark's Gospel.

We are (along with Christians from other denominations) the body of Christ in this area. We are one parish of 5 churches with different styles, just as we are benefice of 6 Anglican Churches. We want to show that and live that and enjoy that more in the years ahead. How might you play your part in seeing these links grow greater fruit?
