FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 13: 34-35

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres." 1 Corinthians 13: 4-7

Over the last two weeks I've written a little about some of the blessings and struggles with being a multi church parish. The things I've mentioned are by no means an exhaustive list, but my hope is that it has stimulated some conversations and got you thinking about how to build on those strengths and how to mitigate those difficulties.

This all matters because of the challenge that Jesus gave us as his disciples. As Christians we are called to love one another. And the kind of love we are to show is defined by Jesus. As we saw last Sunday, that demands active, willing and sacrificial service. If we fail to do that, then the world will not look at us and see Jesus. And if they do not see him, then why would they be interested in the message he calls us to share with them?

As we round up this miniseries let me suggest six ways of loving one another as Jesus loved us, even as we wrestle with the practical difficulties of being 5 churches in one parish.

- **1: Get to know one another**. This will involve time and effort, and the giving and receiving of hospitality. Start in your own worshipping community and then, as you get to know people from other churches, reach out to them as well. The more you know people from different churches, the more we will feel and then behave as one Church.
- **2: Pray for one another.** How often do you pray for your own church? How often do you pray for the other churches in our parish? Why not pray for a different church every week. And in our intercessions in our individual churches, let's start praying for the LORD to be at work in the other worshipping communities. It's very hard to be resentful or unkind about churches or congregations we are praying for! Our prayers will break down barriers.

- **3: Worship alongside one another.** Make sure that 5th Sunday services are a priority, even if the style on that Sunday is not quite to your liking. There are other opportunities as well: we now have services of Evensong every couple of months. Over the last weekend of June, we'll be having our next parish weekend at home. Put the dates in your diary and come along! The Parish Prayer Gathering runs every week so why not come along, say once a month? And when we run courses or one-off events, why not seriously think about joining in. You'll grow in your faith, and you will grow in your relationships with others in our parish.
- **4: Serve alongside one another**. One of the best ways to build community is to serve alongside each other. This is true in our own worshipping communities where we often need teams to take care of the grounds, the cleaning and the refreshments as well as the pastoral visiting. Why not see if you could set up a small group in your church to get involved in one of these areas. Perhaps a team of you could throw a summer tea party for those who live near the church and work together on ways to invite people along. One of the best ways to build a stronger parish is to have five strong churches.

But there are also opportunities to serve at the parish level by getting involved in our coffee mornings, or in some shared ministries to schools, nursing homes or with our outreach in town. Standing for election to the PCC is also a great way to serve not just your own worshipping community but the wider parish. As we serve alongside one another bonds of Christian friendship will grow.

- **5: Remember the benefits!** Do you remember the old hymn which tells us to *'count your blessings name them one by one.... And it will remind you what the LORD has done.'* That's great advice for the Christian life, but it's also great advice for us as five churches in one parish. Don't forget the benefits we have together, the shared resources, the greater opportunities, the wider variety. Remind yourself of those when things get tough and thank God for them. That way the difficulties will never overwhelm you.
- **6: Keep your eyes on Jesus and grow as his disciple**. The best way for us to overcome these or any other challenges is to keep our eyes on Jesus and grow in our faith. As we read His Word and let the Holy Spirit apply it to our lives, we are changed more into the likeness and character of Jesus. Patient and kind. Humble and gentle. Forgiving quickly when things go wrong. Serving willingly without counting the cost. Seeking the best for others and rejoicing in the truth and the work God is doing amongst us as He builds His kingdom here.

What will that mean for you, I wonder? What changes will it mean in your worshipping community? And who will you reach out to first? Let us press on together and become the **faithful**, **welcoming**, **varied**, **active** and **loving church** that we are called to be.


Ogwell Coffee Mornings resume on Friday 28th February, 10 a.m. at St Bartholemew's Church.

There has been a lot of press coverage around the controversial Assisted Dying bill currently going through the committee stage in Parliament, and having had conversations with various people, we've decided to hold an evening of talks and discussion to help us think through this very emotive issue. The evening will be in 3 parts:

- 1: Thinking through how we, as Anglican Christians, should approach complex moral issues.
- 2: Hearing a clear Christian view on this issue.
- 3: Considering how we can speak about and deal with issues of death and dying in a way that reflects the great hope we have as Christians.

After each input there will be time for round table discussions and questions.



Matt Searles: In Quietness and Trust:

Early in his ministry, Jesus gave his followers a description of how he wants his people to live. Rather than seeking to ascend to God, Christian discipleship is a downward flourishing; a countercultural way of blessing. These 40 devotions, with a daily reading and short reflection, will guide you through the beatitudes Jesus gave in the Sermon on the Mount. This Easter, join Jesus on his path to the cross, and see that his way - though so different to the way of the world - leads to freedom, joy, and life. This book has eight groups of five devotions, with each group focusing on the theme of one of the beatitudes from Matthew's gospel. Each day there is a verse or passage from Scripture with an accompanying devotion, a prayer and a song. 
