FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends

Over this and the following 6 issues, I'm going to offer various Lenten reflections on walking the way of the cross. The aim is to help us reflect on the call of Jesus in Mark 8:34-38.

³⁴ Then Jesus called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵ For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. ³⁶ What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? ³⁷ Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? ³⁸ If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels." (NIV)

What follows is a brief over-view, but over the coming weeks we'll delve more closely into various parts of our lives, asking that God would help us live as Christ's disciples.

Firstly, it's clear that following Jesus requires sacrifice.

Denying oneself is obviously sacrificial. Those following Jesus will end up doing some things they would obviously not otherwise have done and will end up not doing some things that they would otherwise have enjoyed doing. This will not always be easy. No self-denial is. So, what things can we point to that we now do which we would never have done without being a Christian? And what things have we stopped doing? And how has that changed over the last year? If it has remained the same, what might that say to us?

Secondly, it's clear that such sacrifice impacts on every part of our lives.

We have largely lost the full impact of Jesus' words to *take up our cross*. Originally it was a sure sign that you were on your way to your death. And an horrendously painful one at that. No part of life would be unaffected by such an act. Death changes everything. By coming to Christ, we have died to self and been given a new life. A life to live for God. So, are there parts of our lives that remain unaffected by this change? Why is that?

Thirdly, it's clear that such sacrifices may appear madness to the world.

Our culture lives for now, not for eternity. It views suffering as an evil to be avoided and seeks an easy-going life of pleasure where all our desires are fulfilled. The Christian walks a very

different path, a path with eternity in view, where vastly different values apply. Is that true of us? Or do our lives look exactly like those of our neighbours and friends?

Fourthly, it's clear that we are called to walk this way because this is the way Jesus walked.

The call here is to follow Jesus, who walked the way before us. And if all this seems a little too much for God to ask, why not take a moment to list down all the sacrifices Jesus made, the things he put down and took up, and consider if you are glad he did. If so, we will gladly follow his lead and his call, no matter what it requires of us.


