FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends

I like detective stories. I enjoy watching the way they first collect the evidence and then piece it together. At first, all they have are questions. Who? Why? When? How? But by the time the story concludes, all the pieces have fallen into place.

We left Peter last week walking back from the empty tomb with his mind racing with so many questions. But by the end of the day, many of those questions had been answered and he knew without a shadow of a doubt that Jesus Christ had been raised from the dead and was very much alive.

Frustratingly, we don't know anything about Peter's first encounter with the risen Jesus. All we have is Luke 24: 34. The two disciples who met Jesus on the road to Emmaus had run back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples the news. But when they got there, they found the eleven and those with them, assembled together and saying, "it is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." Perhaps Peter hung around at the tomb and saw Jesus speaking to Mary. Perhaps he went back to the tomb after Mary had come to the disciples and had a one-on-one encounter with him himself. We simply don't know. What we do know is that Peter met the risen Jesus before the disciples on the road to Emmaus returned, and then, together with the other disciples he encountered Jesus again in the upper room.

Luke's description of that meeting is interesting. There was joy and doubt. There was peace and confusion. Dead people don't normally come back to life again. People who have been brutally beaten and crucified don't walk around perfectly whole and happy just three days later. So no wonder the disciples found it all so hard to comprehend. And yet Jesus had risen! And the proof of it? Jesus spoke with them, allowed himself to be touched by them, and then he ate with them, as if to prove that he wasn't a ghost or something of their imagination. (See Luke 24: 36-49 and John 20: 19-23)

Over the next 40 days Jesus appeared to his disciples many times, we'll consider a few of those times in the coming weeks. And it was the fact of Jesus' physical resurrection that changed everything for them, and for all believers since.

So it's the resurrection that Peter cites as proof of Jesus' divine identity in his Pentecost Day sermon in Acts 2. It is the resurrection that forms the basis for our hope of forgiveness (see Acts 5:29-32) and it is the resurrection of Jesus which is the foundation for the Christian hope of life

after death. In fact, without the resurrection, the Apostle Paul says that Christians are to be pitied more than all people. (See 1 Corinthians 15: 14-19)

So how convinced are you of Jesus' physical resurrection? Perhaps, like Thomas, you'd really like to see for yourself! But whilst we may not be able to do that, we do have many eyewitness accounts in the Bible. As with many things in life, we don't actually need to see them before we believe them, for the evidence is overwhelming. We have the evidence of the eyewitness statements, the empty tomb itself and the evidence of the way this event changed the lives of the disciples and ended up changing the world. You and I would not have heard of Jesus unless the resurrection happened, because the disciples would have had no good news to tell. History itself, then, is perhaps the greatest evidence for the truth of the resurrection.

Peter saw and believed- and it changed his life. As we reflect on the events of the first Easter, perhaps we should ask ourselves to what extent the resurrection of Jesus has changed ours. Grace and peace,



"Despite our best efforts, and a lot of work, and because of a change to the way bank accounts run for charities, this has taken far longer than we expected, and is still not in place. This means the formation of the Charitable Incorporated Organisation is not complete."
