FROM DAVID WITCHELL on 50th Anniversary of his Ordination this June.

Dear friends in Newton Abbot and Ogwell,

Thank you to Dave for kindly inviting me to share some reflections fifty years after my ordination in Peterborough Cathedral at Petertide, June 1975. I still remember the bishop's advice to preach on the collect and to get myself a television set. Succinct advice indeed. I also remember advice from elsewhere that a house-going parson makes a church-going people.

Without doubt things have changed since the 1970s. There were more people in church in those days. Evensong was clearly dwindling however, never having recovered, it was said by some, after the hugely popular 'Forsythe Saga', televised on Sunday evenings the previous decade. Much of the radical theology of the 1960s was on the wane, but the teaching on marriage and human relationships was still quite clear. Donald Coggan was Archbishop of Canterbury, Harold Wilson was Prime Minister, and The Bay City Rollers were in full swing.

I served two curacies, the usual pattern then for the newly ordained, first in Northampton and then in Oakham in the smallest county of Rutland. In both parishes I enjoyed the company of fellow curates, when clergy were more plentiful, and since then I have always valued working with colleagues. My first incumbency was in the villages of Weedon and Everdon, in the Rugby-Daventry area where the BBC masts of the former Third Programme towered nearby, occasionally threatening to interfere with television reception. This was followed by a parish in the middle of Wellingborough, where standing outside the church we could savour the smell of the Weetabix factory several miles away if the wind was in our direction. It was there where most of my children grew up, and we were blessed to have two church schools which were an integral part of that parish's ministry. Finally, coming down to Paignton seemed like a great adventure as we moved two hundred miles from the very centre of the country to our parish on the coast with its bracing sea breezes.

My duties as rural dean opened up wider aspects of ministry to the clergy and parishes of different traditions and challenges, with participation in deanery planning. Music and children's work were valuable contacts with the Families Department of the Mothers Union for their festivals and fun days, and it was a privilege to serve for a while as their chaplain. Work on the diocesan board of education enabled me to appreciate the invaluable role of church schools, even though I myself had only taught for two years. Chaplaincies with the Air Training Corps were useful links with young people who may or may not have had any connection with the church.

Although my time in ministry had its good times and more challenging moments, I never suffered from boredom. The day-to-day pastoral ministry is so varied, with the privileges of being privy to

the many aspects of the human experience and condition. As we clergy are there to serve the people in their joys and sorrows and in-betweens, so the whole Body of Christ has its part to play in serving, caring and praying. There is, of course, the sacred task for the minister of preaching the Gospel, leading worship and celebrating the sacraments. The Gospel message never changes, even if we have to find new ways of doing things.

The church has had to adapt over the years. We are now in a climate which is less sympathetic to Christianity, and in some places anti-Christian. This upsets some, but I sense the majority of church people are just getting on with their belief and Christian action in their own way. People come to church for personal reasons of faith rather than accepted custom. More congregations and individuals are facing the challenges of our changing society. There are people from the pews who are gladly accepting positions of leadership and responsibility. Exciting and imaginative new ways of discipleship have emerged, with fresh expressions of faith. The green shoots are here.

'Launch out into the deep', says Jesus to the disciple Peter. Many centuries before we read of the challenge to Joshua, 'Be strong and of good courage'. Words indeed to encourage and inspire us today.

May the Lord bless you. It is always a joy to share your fellowship.
