FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I don't know who you would have on your top 10 heroes of faith from the Old Testament, but I suspect the first one listed in Hebrews 11 would be a bit of a surprise. Why is it? It is Abel- one of the sons of Adam and Eve and the first murder victim in world history! So why is Abel there?

Remember that those on the list are being commended for their faith, and helpfully, Hebrews 11 verses 1 to 3 tell what that kind of faith is:

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. ² This is what the ancients were commended for. ³ By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

So Biblical faith has a number of elements. As the Hope Explored course puts it:

It is a **confident hope in the future (***a future we cannot yet see*) **based on true events in the past** (*the fact that the universe was created at Giod's command*) **that changes everything about our present**.

For Abel, it meant that he was willing to bring to God a sacrifice of his choicest animals: "*fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock*." and to offer them as a sacrifice. (See Genesis 4:4) This would have been a costly act of worship. And don't miss the detail there: this was an act of **worship**, not a sacrifice for sin. As the harvest came, so both brothers offered to God an offering of thanksgiving, giving back to God some of what God He had given to them. Cane offered some of the fruits of the soil, but Abel, rather than keeping the best for himself, offered to God the choicest elements of his herds.

Why was Abel willing to do that? Because of his confident hope in the future and his trust that the God who had blessed him with so much would continue to care for him and provide for all his needs. Abel knew that all his days and all his needs were in the hands of a powerful, good and generous God. So, he need not hold on to things, he could give generously and trust God for what comes next.

In the same way, our level of thankfulness to God and our confidence in God's love and care and his future provision will also have a huge impact on our giving, whether money, time or talents. The more we remember what God has done for us in the past (especially through Jesus), and the more we fix our eyes on what God has prepared for those who love him in the future (I'm

thinking of eternity here), the more we will willingly give and serve with a generosity of heart that rivals Abel's.

In some ways then, our willingness to give and serve generously in proportion to that which God has given us, is a marker of our faith and thankfulness. Will be as faithful as Abel? When it comes to generosity and trust, Abel is a hero we should aim to emulate.

Most grateful thanks from Clive Sawers.

After over seventeen years as one of the organists in the Benefice, initially covering services at St Paul's, but later playing regularly at Highweek and Ogwell, I found that the workload had become too much for me to continue in the same way into yet another autumn and Christmas season with all the special services involved. So, it was with a heavy heart and much sadness, but also some relief that I tendered my resignation to the Rector in March to come into effect at the end of June. That period, just over three months, would provide some opportunity to regroup and work out a suitable way forward. As part of the process, I have offered to continue to play for the monthly BCP Holy Communion at St Mary's which I have always enjoyed, and I've offered to cover emergencies if I can.

Word spread rapidly about my intended departure following which I have received many kind comments from those for whom I have had the privilege to play. I've long since lost count of the number of services that I have covered since arriving at St Paul's, to which I can include a number of Carol Services at St Mary's and later St Bartholomew's during my early years; then when the new parish of Newton Abbot was established All Saints, Highweek was added to the list. I've only very occasionally played the magnificent organ at Abbotsbury Church for services.

As ever, organists are usually pretty shattered by the end of December and an interesting comment noted by a member of one of the Facebook groups was: "Is anyone else, like me, running on empty?" I certainly related to that, and while December 29 saw an excellent service at St Mary's with approaching 100 communicants, I noted later that afternoon that the music for a service streamed online from Ripon Cathedral was led entirely from the organ with no choir present who presumably had the Sunday off!

So, it can be a lonely job for any organist, made much more difficult for me by my increasing deafness; when Steve and I were delegated last September to help out at St Luke's, Milber, his greatest concern was that the hymns would not be announced. My response was rather simple, that I would probably not hear any announcement anyway! Very often we were expected to dash across town from either All Saints, or St Bartholomew's to arrive at St Luke's with about five minutes to spare and to check the details of the service and to be ready to start the opening hymn upon the ringing of the bell, which I wouldn't hear anyway! Fortunately, the congregation stands at that point which makes life easy enough as I can see very well from the organ loft.

I'm enormously grateful for all the encouragement and support from so many people in our congregations and for the acceptance on one or two rare occasions when I have inflicted some of my own hymns or hymn-tunes upon you. Some years ago, it was my carol "Let's go to Bethlehem!" and more recently "Praise to the Lord we sing today", first sung at All Saints, Highweek in March 2023. This latter was reproduced at High Leigh in July 2024 at the annual conference of the Hymn Society and has now been entered into a competition being run by Jubilate Hymns looking for new material potentially for inclusion in the hymnbooks; I really don't expect to see any hymn of mine included anywhere during my lifetime but perhaps my offspring might; and who knows, they might even collect some royalties!

Back to earth with a bump, let me thank you all again and particularly for the generous gift received on my final service at St Paul's which I am sure will contribute greatly towards the joy of our lovely garden, now looking its best despite the dry weather. The magnificent Magnolia tree in the front garden has managed to retain many seed pods from the exuberant March flowering, and as these expand and weigh the branches down, the seeds will likely begin to fall out in the autumn and we'll try to grow some new Magnolias though we don't ever expect to see them flower in our lifetime.
