## FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends.

After a few weeks enjoying some summer Psalms, we'll be beginning our autumn teaching programme this coming Sunday with a return to the book of Isaiah. This will be followed by 7 weeks in the gospel of Mark which will take us to Advent. Alongside the Isaiah readings we'll continue to hear passages from John's Gospel, and alongside our weeks in Mark we'll have the chance to hear the wonderful but short Old Testament book of Habakkuk.

If you are new to our Parish, you might be wondering how and why these topics are chosen, and why, unlike many Anglican churches, we do not follow the set Church of England readings called the Lectionary. I'll answer those 2 questions next week. This week I want to answer a more fundamental question: **Why do we use the Bible at all?** 

Perhaps the answer seems obvious. "We're a Christian Church. The Christian message is written in the Bible, so of course we have the Bible read and taught in our services!" And that, of course, is right. But we need to push deeper and think what the Bible IS. How we answer that question will determine how we relate to it and how we receive it.

So, what is the Bible?

In terms of **literature**, the Bible isn't just 1 book, but a collection of 66 books (39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament) written by dozens of authors, living in various cultures and spanning a period of around 1500 years. These books are different genres: history books (including the 4 Gospels), law books and poetry books, letters, books of prophecy and books of apocalyptic literature containing visions and dreams about the end of time, often in dramatic and highly symbolic language. This variety makes the Bible very interesting but that's no reason to have it read and explained every Sunday.

In terms of **influence**, no book has had more influence that the Bible. In fact, many now argue that the whole of western civilisation and the culture and values we have today have been formed and shaped by it. This is the theme of 2 recent books: *The Book that Made Your World: How the Bible Created the Soul of Western Civilization* by Vishal Mangalwadi and *Dominion- How the Christian Revolution Remade the World* by Tom Holland. This makes the Bible <u>influential</u>, but the reason we study the Bible goes much further than that.

As a Christian Church, we believe that the Bible is **God's self-revelation** of Himself in written form. So we might call it, as we do in our services, the **Word of the Lord**. The

Bible is God speaking to us. And not just us- it is God speaking to all people across all ages, all cultures and across the world. This raises the importance of the Bible to a whole new level. If the Bible really is God speaking to us, today, then we need to pay close attention to it and base our lives upon it.

In 2 weeks' time, we'll think about why we can truly trust the Bible. For now, let's just note that the Bible is far more than an interesting and influential book. To Christians, the Bible is one of the 3 main ways (the others being creation and the incarnation, life, death and resurrection of Jesus) that Almighty God has chosen to reveal himself to us, and in terms of its clarity and detail, the scriptures are by far the most detailed means God has given us. The Bible tells us how can know God personally, how we should live in His world and how we must prepare for eternity to come. The 39 Articles of Religion, the Church of England's core beliefs, put it this way: 'Holy Scripture containeth all things necessary to salvation.'

The Bible doesn't answer all our questions about God, nor does it tell us all that we might want to know about ourselves and our world: but it does tell us all we need to know. To quote from various parts of the Bible, the Word of God in the scriptures is:

**God-breathed** and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2 Tim. 3:16–17

The law of the Lord is **perfect**, reviving the soul; Psalm 19:7

The unfolding of your words gives *light*; it gives understanding to the simple. Ps. 119:130

For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the **power of God** for salvation to everyone who believe. Romans 1:16

That's why we spend so much time in our services listening to the Bible read and explained, why we try to choose hymns that tell of Gospel truths, and why we encourage everyone who wants to know God better to study God's Word on a daily basis.

So, are you ready to hear God speak to you?
