FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends.

I wonder if you remember some of the snippets of advice that you were given as you were growing up. Look both ways when you cross the road. Don't play with fire. Make sure you eat your greens. They are good bits of practical wisdom. St Paul would agree, and in today's trustworthy saying he adds something else that we are often being told. Physical exercise is good for you! But the apostle doesn't stop there. He moves on from what is good for the body to what is of greater value for the soul.

For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come. This is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance. 1 Timothy 4:8-9

<u>Most</u> of us take note of things that will help keep us physically healthy. We try to make sure we get enough sleep; we watch our diet; we limit our alcohol intake - or at least we try. And, from time to time, we decide to get more exercise. Perhaps that is in spurts. I regularly start running again, each time working through the couch to 5K programme from start to finish. But since I really dislike running, I usually end up stopping soon after. Only to start again a few months later!

I wonder if my attitude to running sounds familiar to you in how you pursue the godliness that Paul speaks of here. We know deep down that growing closer to God and more like Christ is the best thing we can do, but if we're honest, our determination waxes and wanes. There are seasons of greater devotion to prayer and Bible reading, to attending church and serving God actively, but then things fade. Perhaps we stop enjoying those times as much as we did, so we don't continue. Perhaps life throws up challenges that mean that we have less free time, and so things that aid our pursuit of godliness are the first to go from our diaries. Perhaps later, like with my running, we decide to start again, but even that gets harder and harder to do that as the years go by.

In this trustworthy saying, St Paul would encourage us to reorder our priorities and make pursuing God our chief aim above all others. Physical activity has some value he says, and he's right. But pursuing God and his kingdom, seeking to grow in godliness and walk in God's ways has a value that surpasses all. It's good for this life: bringing greater joy and deeper peace; providing us with comfort and purpose, guidance and direction as we know more of God and experience more of God as His Word is applied to our hearts by the work of His Holy Spirit. But it is also great news for the life to come because pursuing Christ, walking in his ways, growing in his likeness is the best way we can 'make our calling and election sure.' 2 Peter 1:10

As you've heard me say many times before, we are not saved by our good works or religious devotion, but a closeness to God and an ongoing transformation into the character of Jesus are wonderfully assuring signs that we are truly saved. In the same way that keeping up with a rigorous exercise programme shows that we are convinced that physical fitness matters, a steady, unfading pursuit of godliness shows that we truly believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that we now belong to him.

I usually wait until after Christmas to restart my running programme, but we can begin again with Christ any time. So, if your pursuit of godliness has waned of late, why not start afresh today. Make yourself a cup of tea or coffee. Find somewhere quiet to sit. Then open up your Bible and start reading, praying as you do that God would speak to you through His Word, and that He'd give you the grace and courage to obey.

Notes from our PCC Meeting Earlier this Week

'How can we support our clergy and their families? How can we ensure the future and financial stability of our churches? These are two of the issues the PCC explored this week.

Rev Alan Jonas gave a presentation on the Clergy Care Covenant used in the Diocese of Guildford which suggests actions of clergy, congregation and diocese to support the well-being of clergy and their families. This is based on recommendations from General Synod in 2019 but has not yet been actioned in this diocese. We have agreed to pass this forward to our Deanery Synod, but in the meantime have taken to implement the covenant in our churches. We already support our clergy in, for example, making an annual retreat and in respecting their days off and our treasurer supported us in agreeing to a book fund of £400 yearly for them. These steps will be reviewed annually. Full details of this covenant will be available to you soon.

As we approach the end of 2025, our Parish's financial position is pleasing - thanks to you and praise to God! This year we have paid our Common Fund contributions to the diocese and funded long overdue work to make our churches warm and welcoming using legacies given in past years. Our treasurer is working hard to return expendable funds* held by the Diocese on our behalf to our care - the first parish in the Diocese to do so. This will mean we can access monies more easily.

[*Expendable funds are legacies left for specific reasons/churches (which we will need to honour) but where the whole legacy may be used. The diocese retains control of perpetual legacies (where only the interest may be used).]

Will you join us in our commitment to support the clergy? Are there jobs in our churches we currently rely on the clergy for but which we could well do ourselves? Can we be generous in bearing with each other in the burdens we all carry? Can we support in prayer and encouragement, sharing our time and ideas?

Will you join us in gratitude for the financial provision made in past years? How may we ensure we maintain this provision - Could you Gift Aid your offering? Could you give via the Parish Giving Scheme or consider contactless giving? If you are making a will, could you consider leaving the parish a percentage of your estate, along with other charities you may wish to support, blessing the church of the future?

As a PCC we are encouraged by what we have heard, and we want to encourage you in sharing in the growth of the Church in this town and area.

Sermon Series for Next Year. Over the last month or so Gareth and I have been working on our Sunday Bible teaching plan for the coming year. This is shown below. As you will see, at times over the next 12 months the teaching at Ogwell, Highweek and St Mary's will be different from that at St Paul's and Abbotsbury. 




