FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends

What do you do when things get a little too much, when the pressure builds and you can't think clearly? Perhaps you head to the Moors or go for a walk along the beach. Perhaps you throw yourself into the gardening or the housework. Perhaps you turn on some music or fill up on chocolate or head out to the golf course. For the apostle Peter, his place to think and reset his mind was on the lake fishing.

That's where we find him in John chapter 21. By this point, Jesus had appeared to Peter at least twice, so he knew that his Lord and Master had been raised from the dead. Peter had seen Jesus, touched him, eaten with him, spoken with him. There was no longer any doubt about his resurrection. But there were still some things that had yet to be dealt with. The elephant in the room being Peter's threefold denial on the night Jesus was arrested.

It's interesting, isn't it, that Jesus doesn't take Peter aside straight away to deal with his appalling betrayal. But that shouldn't surprise us. Time and time again in the gospels we find Jesus dealing with people in measured, careful, compassionate ways. So, think of the time he takes to challenge Nicodemus about his need to be born again. Think of the gentle way Jesus speaks with the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus already knew about her scandalous past, but he doesn't mention it until just the right time, and even then, it was in such a way that she stays and continues to talk. It's the same with Peter. I'm sure his guilt weighed heavily upon him. His conscience would have been pricked every time he saw Jesus. But Jesus doesn't rush in. He waits for exactly the right time and the right place to confront Peter with his failings and to draw him back ever so gently into full fellowship once again.

For Peter, the right place was a place where he felt safe: fishing on the lake. Before starting as a disciple Peter made his living fishing, so he and his friends were obviously very good at it. But on this particular night, they had caught nothing. Someone on the shore enquired as to their catch, and when they told him the bad news, they were instructed to let down their nets on the opposite side of the boat. Perhaps there was a sense of authority in his voice because the disciples did what they were told, only to find that their nets were soon bursting at the seams with fish. It's not long before they recognised who the person was. It had to be him, didn't it! It had to be Jesus. And it was. And in that moment Peter was taken back to the time of original callingwhen Jesus had again commanded a miraculous catch (see Luke 5). Being in that familiar place, hearing Jesus' voice, and experiencing Jesus' power was just what Peter needed to be ready to face his past, hear Jesus' words and start again.

Amazingly, Jesus is just as patient with you and me. Just as gentle. And just as in control. And when we are feeling so overwhelmed that we run off to the equivalent of our fishing boats, Jesus, by His Holy Spirit, comes and finds us. And when the time is right, he'll bring us to our knees and then lift us up once more.

So of you are feeling a little overwhelmed with life and a little lost spiritually, perhaps this week would be a good time to head to the garden or coastline or golf course and open yourself up to God and to spend some time waiting on him, talking to him and asking him what he would say to you. He promises draw near to all those who draw near to him. We just have to be ready and willing to listen.
