FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends.

If Abel was a surprise name to find in the Hebrews 11 list of Heroes of faith from the Old Testament, todays topic is even more unknown. His name is Enoch. This is what the writer of Hebrews says about him.

By faith Enoch was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death: "He could not be found, because God had taken him away." For before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God. And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

There are 2 Enoch's in the Bible. One was Cain's first son. The other, the one mentioned in Hebrews 11, was the Adam's great-great-great-great grandson through Seth- who was his third son. That is all we know about him, except for these few verses from Genesis 5:

²¹ When Enoch had lived 65 years, he became the father of Methuselah. ²² After he became the father of Methuselah, Enoch walked faithfully with God 300 years and had other sons and daughters. ²³ Altogether, Enoch lived a total of 365 years. ²⁴ Enoch walked faithfully with God; then he was no more, because God took him away.

Put aside for a moment our questions about the longevity of people's lives back then, the thing that makes Enoch unique is the fact that he didn't die. Instead, because of his great faith, God simply *took him away*. This happens to one other person in the Bible... (can you remember who?) and he doesn't even get named on the list!

But to my mind there is something far more amazing than Enoch's translation straight to glory: and that is the fact that he *walked faithfully with God 300 years*. Was it something about the birth of his son that sparked a real faith in Enoch? We're not told. But from that point on his faithfulness was something that made him stand out in his generation.

We may not live for 300 years, but if we are able to withstand the pull and temptations of the world and remain faithful to God our whole lives long, that in itself is cause for a great celebration in Heaven.

The Bible is clear that walking with Jesus isn't always easy, that's why it describes the life of faith as a fight. (See 1 Timothy 6:12) We're told that our enemy the devil prowls around

trying to catch Jesus' followers out, and we know all too well the pressures of conforming that our own society brings to bear on us, let alone those places where persecution is rife.

We're not told what Enoch endured, but the very fact that he finished the race with his faith strong and firm is good enough to make the list of Old Testament heroes. His story doesn't have the enough to make a gripping biography, and ours might not either. But we can at least seek to emulate his enduring faithfulness however long our lives last.

New Bishop of Crediton Consecrated at St Paul's Cathedral

It was a cause for celebration when The Right Reverend Moira Astin was consecrated as the new Bishop of Crediton in a service at St Paul's Cathedral. Moira was ordained a bishop by the Bishop of London, the Rt. Rev'd Dame Sarah Mulally, who was herself the first female Bishop of Crediton and first female bishop in Devon. Bishop Moira is the third woman in a row to hold the role, following the retirement of Bishop Jackie in January – something we believe is a first in the Church of England!
