Weddings: The beautiful and historic churches in our Parishes are great places to get married. For more information, contact our Parish Administrator.

Baptisms: Baptism is a service of Christian declarations, promises and celebration and a sign of faith. Those coming for baptism are asked to attend church for 3 months and a short baptism course before booking a date. Details on the website.

Home Groups - a great way to go deeper into the Bible and get to know other people. Several home groups meet fortnightly at different times. Join in! Prayer gatherings are central to our life as a Church. Meet every Monday, alternating between 1pm - 1:45pm and 7:45pm - 9pm.

Explore the Christian Faith and claims of Jesus: Short courses run periodically. They're free, there's no singing or prayers, and you won't be asked to read out loud. But you can ask any questions you have.

Other groups: Weekly parent and toddler group at Abbotsbury Church, monthly men's and women's breakfasts, coffee mornings and church family meals at various times and places

Finances: As part of our response to God's mercy, we believe all believers should give generously and regularly to God's work. The Church of England does not fund our activities from the centre, so the money for our clergy and the running of the churches and ministry comes from the congregation. The most efficient way is by monthly standing order, gift aiding where possible.

What we believe

About God: There is only one God who has revealed himself to us through the Bible, through Jesus and through creation to be one God in 3 persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, known as the Trinity. God made everything there is, including people, by his mighty power. God sustains us and calls us to know him and worship him as Lord of our lives. This is for his glory and our great joy!

About us: Human beings are the pinnacle of God's creation and all people are made in the image of God, designed to know Him and enjoy his presence forever. However the Bible tells us that our first parents (Adam + Eve) rebelled against God and rejected his rightful rule - what the Bible calls sin. Sadly we have all gone the same way, the result being a messed up world and messed up lives. Left unforgiven, our sin will lead us to an eternity away from God and everything good in a place the Bible calls Hell. However, the Bible has some great news...

About Jesus: Out of God's deep love, Jesus, the Son of God, came to earth, lived amongst us and showed us what God is like. Born of a virgin, Jesus lived a perfect life, revealing God's wisdom and power in word and deed. Despite this, Jesus died nailed to a Roman Cross. But this was not a mistake. The Bible teaches that Jesus died for our sins, in our place and as our substitute, so that all who trust in him might be forgiven and have eternal life. To prove this, 3 days after his death, Jesus rose again and will one day come back as King and judge.

The Bible is God's written revealed word. It tells us the truth about God, the world and ourselves. Whilst we might sometimes misunderstand it, we believe that the Bible is without error and utterly reliable, so we seek to understand it and obey it, with the help of God's Holy Spirit living in us.

The Church: God's people gathered together, around God's word and around God's table. We meet to encourage each other in our faith and to learn to use the gifts God has given us. No church is perfect, because we are not perfect. And whilst coming to church doesn't make someone a Christian, all Christians are expected to make church a top priority.
